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| BA-G/1 | <p>FRIENDS OF BATH ABBEY</p> <p>The Friends of Bath Abbey was founded in 1948. It describes its work as follows: The Friends of Bath Abbey has been in existence for over 60 years. Our members are of various backgrounds, different ages and come from far and wide but share the same interest and aim. We wish to help preserve, care for and add to the Abbey's magnificent architecture and history in order to ensure future generations can derive great pleasure and enjoyment from it, as we do.</p> <p>There is a great sense of friendship and fellowship among our members and we host a varied programme of events and activities throughout the year. We are delighted to be able to provide a permanent link for those who would like to stay in touch with the life of this church but who perhaps do not use the Abbey as their regular place of worship.</p> <p>Working with the PCC (Parochial Church Council – the body with ultimate responsibility and control), we seek to ensure our contributions are useful, beautiful and long-lasting. While we tend not to be involved with routine maintenance, the Friends often play a major role in restoration work and refurbishment. These range from practical improvements, such as supplying new signage or cleaning the East front, to more extensive projects, including installing new Quire Screens and refurbishing the Sanctuary and Norman Chapels.</p> <p>The Friends' Executive Committee is elected at our Annual General Meeting at the end of January each year. It consists of up to 22 members including representatives from the PCC (Parochial Church Council), the Charter Trustees of Bath and the Bath Deanery Chapter in addition to the nine elected Friends, each of whom stand for three years. The other members are the Rector as President, the Chairman who is appointed by the Rector, the Secretary, Membership Secretary and Treasurer who are appointed by the Committee. | BA-G/3 | BATH ABBEY MOTHERS' UNION AND YOUNG WIVES' GROUP The Bath Abbey Mothers' Union was formed in 1943. According to a history written by Mabel Evenden (BA-G3/D/2/1), it was formed at the suggestion of ladies from St James's Church, who joined the Abbey congregation after St James's was bombed in 1942. Mabel Evenden's history, covering the years 1943-1972, describes how the Mothers' Union was organised, and lists a varied programme of activities. These included services, meetings, a quarterly Communion service, visits and speakers, a prayer group, and Christmas parties. There were 57 members in 1946; this rose to 76 members in the 1950s. A Young Wives' Group was formed in 1951. The Mothers' Union was led by the Rector's wife. The Bath Abbey Mothers' Union is still active today and describes itself as follows: 'The Bath Abbey Mothers' Union (MU) is part of a worldwide Anglican-led organisation with more than 4 million members in over 80 countries. We are a community of like-minded people inspired by Christ to bring a humanitarian response to the needs of families around us and overseas, to be specially concerned with all that strengthens and preserves marriage and Christian family life. We are not all mothers, or even all women! Established in 1943, the Bath Abbey branch continues to | 1940s-2000s |

Its only surviving records are its second minute book, which contains minutes of its Management Committee and Annual General Meetings; and a cash book dating from December 1902-February 1903. Articles about its meetings can be found in the Bath Chronicle. In 1904, its management committee comprised the Reverend Shadwell Keen in the chair, the Reverend FJR Wingfield, and 9 committee members. In 1906, the Club had 50 members. The Club met at Abbey Church House; the minutes suggest that it had its own room and billiard table. Its activities included bagatelle, billiards, and draughts tournaments; a 'Smoking Concert'; an annual outing; a Bible class; and lectures. A Poor Fund is also mentioned. In 1907, subscriptions were 1s 6d per quarter from 1 October-31 March and 1s for 6 months from 1 April-30 September. Annual Reports for years 1906-1908 are enclosed. The Club was suspended during the First World War; its last meeting before the War took place on 1 October 1913 and it did not meet again until 14 October 1919. Minutes of this meeting record, poignantly, that 'membership has been reduced to only a few'. After the First World War, the Club was re-established and new rules were drawn up. Members had to be 17 or over; must attend the Bible class or have attended the previous members' club; be members of the Abbey branch of CEMS or be regular members of the Abbey Congregation. Membership fees were 1/- quarterly, plus an entrance fee of 1/-. Efforts to revive the Club concentrated on recovering the funds of the old Club; raising money for the refurbishment of the Club room and billiard table; organising a smoking concert, and attracting more members. By the early 1920s, the Club seems to have been thriving and its pre-War programme of events (billiards, a smoking concert, and lectures) was re-established. A cricket section was formed in 1923; the minutes comment that its 1925 season was 'very successful'.
